

'Medal' Rules

A maximum of 5 courses can be played in this competition.

Scores from the best 3 rounds will count towards a player's Medal Points (MPs) total score.

- Tee times are to be organised by members individually
- The date when you will play your Medal round must be communicated to the committee prior to playing by sending an e-mail to: medal@baselbaggers.com
- Rounds must be played within the time frame specified by the committee at the beginning of the year
- Only 1 round can be submitted per course
- The Medal is played as a Stableford competition
- Handicaps to be used are the ones from Golfsoftware on the day of play, to be adjusted according to the local course index (day handicap), as published on www.baselbaggers.com.
- Yellow & red tees. The day handicap must reflect the tee played off.
- The following information must be present on the scorecards:
 - ✓ Name & signature of player
 - ✓ Name & signature of marker (must be a Basel Bagger)
 - ✓ Date of play
 - ✓ Tee played off
 - ✓ Handicap & day handicap
 - ✓ SF points (front, back, total)
- Signed score cards (photo or scan) must be sent to medal@baselbaggers.com within 5 days of playing the round

'Medal' Rules

Points Given for Each Medal Round:

The following Medal Points (MPs) will be allocated for each round:

Highest score SF	150 MP
2nd highest score SF	100 MP
3rd highest score SF	80 MP
4th highest score SF	70 MP
5th highest score SF	60 MP
6th highest score SF	50 MP
7th highest score SF	40 MP
8th highest score SF	30 MP
9th highest score SF	20 MP
10th highest score SF	10 MP
11th+ highest score SF	0 MP

Where two (or more) people share the same score Stableford, MPs for the different places will be added up and then divided by the number of players (i.e. if two people come 3rd, each will receive 75 MP (80&70/2), and the player with the next best score will be in 5th place and receive 60MPs).

Winner of the Overall Medal:

The winner of the Medal competition will be the player with the highest total MP score calculated from their 3 best rounds out of the possible 5 rounds.

In Case of a Tie:

In the unlikely event of a tie for 1st place, the following criteria will be used to determine the overall winner (in order of application):

- Overall rankings across the 3 Medal rounds, i.e. no of 1st places, 2nd places etc.
- Total Stableford points for the 3 Medal rounds
- Toss of a coin....
